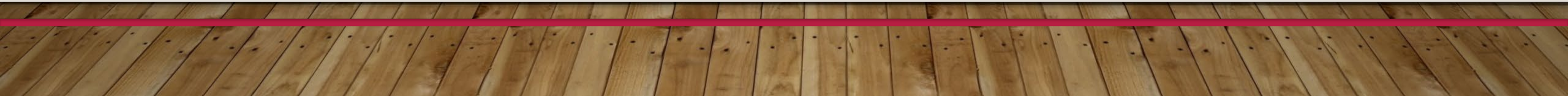



# GSRP REPORTING

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# WHAT IS THE GREAT START READINESS PROGRAM (GSRP)?

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- Michigan's state-funded preschool program for four-year-old children with factors which may put them at risk for low educational attainment
  - Children must be 4 years of age on or before September 1. A waiver is available for families who wish to request early enrollment for children who will turn 4 after September 1, but on or before December 1.
  - Depending on income level, families may be required to pay tuition but are never charged additional fees for program elements such as transportation or meal service

# HOW IS IT FUNDED?


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- GSRP is grant funding and the dollar amount of funding is legislated into the budget every year. When it started as MSRP, it started with 694 slots totaling \$1,000,000. Gov. Whitmer's 2023-24 expansion included an additional \$72 million, for a total investment of \$524 million! This also allowed for a new instructional model of 5 days per week, 36 weeks per year and increased the number of families that can qualify for the program.
- Only an ISD can complete the applications and reports for the GSRP in NexSys on the financial side.
- Funds are appropriated annually based on October 1 – September 30 fiscal year.

# FUNDING ALLOCATION

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- Funding is based on the delivery schedule: Part Day, School Day, or Extended Program.
  - Each child enrolled during the MSDS Early Childhood Fall and Spring Collection is considered to “fill” a discrete space.
  - Programs will not receive more funding than allocated to serve.
  - Children who leave the program must be exited with their accurate exit date entered.
  - If a child leaves one program within the ISD and starts at another program within that same ISD, the ISD will only receiving funding for that child once. The local ISD policy will dictate how the funding will be allocated to the programs.

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# WHO REPORTS THE DATA?

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- It Depends!
  - Some ISDs run a Direct Run model where the ISD runs the classrooms that are contained within the LEA buildings and they take on the reporting responsibilities. They also report the data for Community Based Organizations and Head Start Classrooms.
  - Most ISDs enter into agreements with the LEAs where the pupil accountants end up reporting the data, but the ISD remains the Fiscal Agent. Community Based Organizations and Head Start Classrooms may also report their own data under this model.

# WHEN IS IT REPORTED?

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- The Early Childhood Collection is reported three times per year.
  - Fall Collection: Beginning of Program through October 31
  - Spring Collection: November 1 through Mid February
    - Waitlisted Needs Reported
  - End of Program: February 22 through August 22<sup>nd</sup>
    - August 14<sup>th</sup> Mid-Term DQ Check
    - August 28<sup>th</sup> Certification Deadline
    - Exit Dates on all students need reported
    - 32p & 32p(4) Need Reported


# WHAT IS REPORTED?

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- GSRP data is reported within the Early Childhood Collection. The ECC also contains data from the following required sources:
  - GSRP/Head Start Blend Classes
  - Section 32p, Early Childhood Block Grant
  - Section 32p(4) Home Visitation
  - GSRP – Wait List
  - Head Start (Optional)\*
  - Title I Preschool or Services (Optional)\*
  - Early Head Start (Optional)\*
  - Early Head Start – Child Care Partnership (Optional)\*

*\*It is a federal expectation that children participating in a Head Start, Early Head Start or Early Head Start-Child Care Partnership program be reported, but not required to be reported in our state reporting.*

  - Homeless Status
  - Supplemental Nutrition Eligibility
  - Seclusion & Restraint
  - Immigrant

# DATA PREPARATION

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# MISD-MSDS (MACOMB)

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- Brief look at MISDmsds and Review Fields.
- Use this program to:
  - Store your data if you don't already have a database program.
  - Cleanse your data, even if you have a management system.
  - Massage your data: make edits in mass if needed without harming system in your Student Management System.
  - Combine data from multiple sources into one file.
  - Error check, error check, error check!

# SUBMITTING TO MSDS

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- Loading to Michigan Student Data Systems (MSDS)
  - There is NO APPEND feature for Early Childhood. If you upload a UIC that is already in your staging area, the new record REPLACES the old record.
- Staging Area
  - Check for Errors
  - Check for UIC Resolutions
  - Adding Additional Components (or records if you need to add an additional program)
  - Reports!
    - Validation Detail
    - Missing Student
    - Student List
- Quality Review
  - Fix any Errors.
  - Check out any Warnings

# SUBMITTING TO MSDS

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- Issues to Watch For:
  - Students enrolled at multiple sites throughout the year
  - The wrong Delivery Schedule being used
  - Two UICs for one student or vice versa
- Tip: If you mistakenly entered a student in a previously certified collection that never attended, you can enter that student in the current collection with an exit date the same date as the start date and it will clear the student out in the longitudinal data.
